# Medgar Evers College Snapshot ACADEMIC YEAR 2017-2018

The *Medgar Evers College Snapshot, Academic Year 2017-2018* is an annual publication of the Office of Institutional Research and Assessment. It presents an overview of the College for the year. The most commonly requested data of interest to the College community are presented. The *Snapshot* provides information that is responsive to the basic quantitative needs, and to address the important questions, "Who are the Medgar Evers College students at different stages of their career?" and "How do the Medgar Evers College students persist, perform and progress?" The *Snapshot* provides general information on enrollment, admissions, retention, basic skills and proficiency testing, students' progress and graduation, courses and curricula, faculty and staff, and selected college operations.

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# Medgar Evers College The City University of New York

Medgar Evers College of The City University of New York (MEC) is an undergraduate, coeducational, non-residential institution of higher education located in Central Brooklyn, New York. It was established in 1969 and named for the martyred civil rights leader Medgar Wiley Evers. Medgar Wiley Evers (1925-1963) is the courageous African-American civil rights leader who was assassinated in Mississippi on June 12, 1963. The College's educational philosophy is to provide an affordable first-rate education for the residents of Central Brooklyn, as well as New York City, who might otherwise have no access to college. The College's mission is to meet the educational and social needs of Central Brooklyn and to develop and maintain high quality, professional, career-oriented undergraduate degree programs in the context of a liberal arts education. Serving both traditional and non-traditional students, Medgar Evers College is one of the younger members of The City University of New York (CUNY) family that includes eleven senior colleges, seven community colleges, The Macaulay Honors College and six graduate and professional schools.

Medgar Evers College is a college of and in the community. It was conceived by the Brooklyn community and is the result of the committed work of, and strong advocacy by, the residents of Brooklyn, community organizations, and local elected officials. The original community supporters developed the educational mandate for the College:

- (1) to be a four-year institution offering both associate and baccalaureate degrees:
- (2) to develop improved methods of teaching and innovations in education;
- to emphasize professional studies without neglecting the liberal arts;
   and,
- (4) to be responsive to the needs and to be of service to the community.

On July 30, 1969, the State of New York Regents and the Governor of New York approved the establishment of a four-year institution in Central Brooklyn. On September 28, 1969, the name, "Medgar Evers College", recommended by the Community Council (then known as the Community Advisory Committee), was approved by the CUNY Board. The first freshman class began in 1970. The College admitted its first class of approximately 1,000

students in 1971 and graduated its first class of 94 students in 1974. By Fall 2009, college enrollment had expanded to beyond 7,000 students in its regular academic programs and over 2,000 students in adult and continuing education.

In keeping with its mission, Medgar Evers College from the beginning has offered both associate and baccalaureate degrees. In September 1976, as a result of the 1975-76 fiscal crisis in New York City, the CUNY Board recommended, and the State approved, the change in the funding status of MEC to that of a community college. With the combined efforts of a coalition of faculty, students, and community stakeholders that successfully lobbied State legislators to maintain the College's baccalaureate degree programs, the College continued to operate as a senior college, offering both associate and baccalaureate degrees from 1976 to 1994, yet was funded as a community college. On June 8, 1994 the College was restored to its original senior college status and to senior college funding by the same kinds of advocacy that called MEC into existence, coupled with the support of the Chancellor and the CUNY Board of Trustees.

During the Academic Year 2017-2018, Medgar Evers College offered nineteen (19) baccalaureate degrees, nine (9) associate degrees and one credit-bearing certificate in its degree-granting programs. The School of Professional and Community Development offered through the Academy for Youth, fifteen (15) active programs serving a total of 9,166 participants; the Adult and Continuing Education program served 2,557 adults; the Academy for Career Pathways programs enrolled 427 participants; and its Research and Advocacy Centers served 5,187 participants for the academic year.

In Fall 2017, the College opened the School of Education that houses the College's pre-college Pipeline program and two academic departments, aiming to transform urban education by meeting the challenges of educating and counseling underserved New York City school children.

Fall 2017 also marked the birth of the Department of Social Work within the School of Liberal Arts. Spring 2018, the Department of Foreign Languages was renamed the Department of World Languages and Cultures.

In Fall 2018, the School of Liberal Arts started enrolling students in two new academic programs: The AA program in English, and the BFA program in Fine Arts.



# MEDGAR EVERS COLLEGE HIGHLIGHTS

#### **ACADEMIC YEAR 2017-2018**


#### TOTAL STUDENT ENROLLMENT

 During the academic year 2017-2018, the College experienced a decrease in fall enrollment. Fall 2017 enrollment decreased 2.4% from the previous fall semester, from 6,819 to 6,652. From Spring 2017 to Spring 2018, enrollment increased 7.4% from 6,353 to 6,822, largely due to the increase of non-degree high school students from 292 in Spring 2017 to 913 in Spring 2018.




- The average FTE of AY 2017-2018 was 5139.8, reflecting a 1.2% increase from the previous academic year at 5076.6.
- Enrollment to FTE ratio was 1 to 0.794 for Fall 2017 and 1 to 0.731 for Spring 2018, an increase from 0.785 in Fall 2016 but a slight decrease from 0.754 in Spring 2017.
- Entering freshman admission increased slightly in the fall semester by 4.0%, from 1,143 in Fall 2016 to 1,189 in Fall 2017. In the Spring 2018 semester, entering freshman enrollment of 355 is 10.6% higher than the previous spring semester enrollment of 321.
- Advanced standing transfer students fall semester admission decreased by 9.4% from 553 in Fall 2016 to 501 in Fall 2017. The Spring 2018, the enrollment headcount of 339 was the same as the prior Spring semester.
- The percentage of baccalaureate student enrollment increased for the third consecutive year for the fall semester, from 44.9% in Fall 2014 to 49.4% in Fall 2017. Spring semester enrollment experienced a slight drop from 50.2% in Spring 2017 to 48.5% in Spring 2018.

- The 2017 enrollment for the freshman class decreased for the second consecutive year in both the fall and spring semesters. Fall enrollment decreased 2.5% from 2,610 in Fall 2016 to 2,544 in Fall 2017. In the spring semester, the decrease was 5.9% from 2,084 in spring 2017 to 1,960 in spring 2018.
- Sophomore enrollment decreased by 10% from 1,559 in Fall 2016 to 1,403 in Fall 2017. Spring enrollment decreased by 11.2% from 1,588 in Spring 2017 to 1,410 in Spring 2018.
- Junior enrollment increased by 1% from 1,059 in Fall 2016 to 1,070 in Fall 2017.
   Spring enrollment increased by 13.9% from 989 in Spring 2017 to 1,126 in Spring 2018.
- The senior class enrollment increased in the fall semester for the third consecutive year. Fall semester increased by 0.84% from 1177 in Fall 2016 to 1,187 in Fall 2017. However, spring enrollment decreased by 3.6% from 1,263 in Spring 2017 to 1,217 in Spring 2018.
- Seventy-two percent (72.2%) of students attended full-time in Fall 2017, compared to 69.8% in Fall 2016. Spring 2018 full-time attendance was 63.5%, compared to 65% in Spring 2017.
- Female enrollment was 72% in Fall 2017, the same as Fall 2016. Male enrollment was 28% in Fall 2017, the same as Fall 2016.
- The average age of all students in Fall 2017 was 26.6 years, a slight decrease from 27 years in Fall 2016. The median age in Fall 2017 was 23 years, the same as in the previous two years.
- Students under age 21 rose by almost 3 percentage points to 33.7% in Fall 2017.
   The percentage of students 21-25 years decreased to 27.6% from 29.4% in the previous fall.



- 69.2% of all students enrolled were American citizens; 20.4% permanent residents; 0.8% Foreign Student (F1); 0.2% non-resident aliens; 9.4% unknown or other status.
- 1,636 of the total student population (24.6%) had a country of origin other than the United States. Of these foreign-born students, Jamaicans were the largest group (23.5%), followed by Haitians (15.3%), Guyanese (13.1%), and Trinidadians (10.1%).
- Based on class levels in Fall 2017, freshmen comprised the largest class (38.2%), sophomores, the next largest (21.1%), and junior and senior students together comprised 34% of the College population. Non-degree students constituted the smallest group at 6.7%.




- In Fall 2017, 49.4% of all students were enrolled in baccalaureate degree programs; 43.2% in associate degree programs; 0.5% in certificate programs; 6.7% non-degree, and 0.1% CUNY BA.
- The School of Science, Health and Technology had the largest enrollment in Fall 2017 (35%), followed by the School of Liberal Arts (32.8%). The School of Business had 18.4% of the fall enrollment, followed by the newly formed School of Education which constituted 6.4% in fall 2017.
- The School of Business had the highest percentage of baccalaureate students within the school, at 64.5%, the School of Science, Health and Technology had 60.1%, he School of Liberal Arts had 44.1%, and the School of Education, 31.8%.
- The most popular program in Fall 2017 was the AA in Liberal Arts, which enrolled 1,220 students. The second largest program was Biology, BS, enrolling 1,142 students, followed by the AS in Science program, enrolling 641 students, the BA in Psychology, enrolling 439 students and the BS in Business, enrolling 408 students.

#### **ENROLLMENT BY GENDER**

- In Fall 2017, male students were more likely to attend full-time (75.6%) than female students (71.0%).
- Male students still tended to be younger in Fall 2017. Comparing the age distributions of male and female students as separate groups, the percentage of male students at age 25 or younger was 70.8%, a total of 13.2 percentage points more than the percentage of the same age group for female students, at 57.6%.
- As for baccalaureate student enrollment, the female students were more likely to be in baccalaureate majors (50.1% in fall 2017) than male students (47.6%).
- Considering the classification distribution in each gender, male students had a
  higher percentage of freshmen (43.7%) than the female students (36.1%). The
  percentages at the sophomore level were reversed: a lower percentage of the
  male students (19.2%) were sophomores compared to the female students
  (21.8%). The percentage of female junior students (17.5%) was higher than
  males (13%). The percentage of female senior students (18.5%) was also higher
  than males (16.2%).

#### RETENTION AND ACADEMIC PROGRESS


• The Fall 2016 to Fall 2017 retention rate for degree seeking students was 62.2%; the Fall 2017 to Spring 2018 retention rate for degree-seeking students was 75.5%; the Spring 2017 to Fall 2017 retention rate was 75.2%.



• By classification, the Fall 2016 to Fall 2017 retention rate for freshmen was 56%; for sophomore students, 69.4%; juniors, 72.9%, and senior students, 78%.

- By admission type, the Fall 2016 to Fall 2017 retention rate for first-time freshmen was 58.9%; transfer retention rate was 49.9%. The continuing student retention rate from Fall 2016 to Fall 2017 was 72.2%. Readmitted student retention rate was 48.4%.
- Overall, the Fall 2016 to Fall 2017 retention rate of 62.2% for degree-seeking students reflects a sizable decrease of 5.3 percentage points from the previous year.
- Considering first-time admitted students, the Fall 2016 to Fall 2017 retention rate for first-time freshman rose by 1.2 percentage points to 58.9% whereas, transfer students rate decreased substantially by 9.1 percentage points to 49.9%.
- The Fall 2016 to Fall 2017 retention rate of 56% for the freshman class reflected a 1.9 percentage points decrease from the previous year.
- The Fall 2016 to Fall 2017 retention rate of 69.4% for sophomore students represents a 0.7 percentage point decrease from the rate of 70.1% in the previous year.
- For the junior class, the Fall 2016 to Fall 2017 retention rate of 72.9% represents a 1.5% percentage points decrease from the previous year's rate of 74.4%.
- For the senior class, the Fall 2016 to Fall 2017 retention rate of 78% represents a 3.2 percentage point decrease from 81.2% in the previous studied period.


#### **ADMISSIONS**



• First-time freshman demographics: 64.2% female; average age 20.2; median age 19; 96.2% full-time.

- First-time transfer demographics: 76.4% female, average age 29.3, median age 27, 70.5% full-time.
- Twenty-eight percent (27.5) of the first-time transfer students were freshmen: average total transferred credits were 68.3 for Baccalaureate and 35.2 for Associate. Almost forty percent (38.8%) of transfers came from a CUNY college.
- Readmitted student demographics: 78.9% female; 31.3 years average age; 28 years median age; 58.7% full-time.
- Roughly one-fifth (20.9%) of all first-time freshmen in Fall 2017 were foreign born.


# **BASIC SKILLS, PLACEMENT AND PROFICIENCY TESTS**



- About 91.0% of first-time freshmen placed in Fall 2017 exited Reading; 91.5% exited Writing; 67.8% exited Math. Spring numbers were 84.2% for Reading, 80.3% for Writing and, 51.8% for Math.
- Ninety-seven percent (97.6) of first-time transfers placed in Fall 2017 exited Reading; 97.0% exited Writing; 84.6% exited Math. Spring numbers were 97.6% for Reading, 96.5% for Writing, and 80.5% for Math.
- The percentage of first-time freshmen who were proficient in all three placement skills in Fall 2017 was 62.7%, a 24.5 percentage points increase over the percentage in Fall 2016.
- The percentage of first-time transfer students who were proficient in all three placement skills in Fall 2017 was 82.8%, a 6.3 percentage point increase from the percentage in Fall 2016.

- The percentage of first-time freshmen who were proficient in Math in Fall 2017 increased by 26.7 percentage points over the previous fall semester, from 41.1% to 67.8%.
- The percentage of first-time freshmen who were proficient in Math in Spring 2018 increased 4.4 percentage points from the previous spring semester, from 47.4% to 51.8 %.
- Two percent (2.6%) of the first-time-freshmen and 0.4% of transfer students failed all of the three tests in Fall 2017.
- Of those first-time freshmen who registered in Fall 2017, 5.6% were placed in upper level developmental reading, and 7.1% in upper level developmental writing. Thirteen percent (12.7%) were placed in lower level developmental Math, and about the same percentage (12.3%) were placed in upper level developmental Math.
- Pass rates in the fall and spring semesters for Reading and Writing ranged from 60.9% to 69.5%. Lower level developmental Math pass rates ranged from 49.2% to 49.6% and upper level developmental Math pass rates ranged from 33.9% to 34.3%.


#### **FINANCIAL AID**



 Sixty-eight percent (68%) of all students received some form of financial aid in AY 2016 - 2017. Total financial aid awards increased by 0.4% from the previous year but total financial aid dollars decreased by 1.8%. Eighty-four percent (84%) of all first-time freshman received some form of financial aid.

- Total Pell grant dollars accounted for 27.1% of total financial aid awards. Total federally funded programs accounted for 45.8% of total financial aid dollars.
- The percentage of students receiving Pell grants increased from 50.8% in the previous academic year to 58.0%. The number of Pell grants awarded during AY 2016-2017 increased from 4,743 in the previous year to 4,749. Total Pell grant dollars increased by 1.3% from the previous year.
- Tuition Assistant Program (TAP) grants accounted for 20.5% of total financial aid awards. Total TAP dollars accounted for 24.8% of total financial aid dollars. Total TAP grant dollars decreased from \$13,399,961 to \$13,371,334.
- Total direct loan awards increased by 6.2% from AY 2015-2016; however, total direct loan dollars decreased by 1.5%.


#### COURSES AND CURRICULUM



- FTE taught by schools in Fall 2017: Liberal Arts: 45.3% of total FTE; Science, Health and Technology: 33.6%; Business: 13.1%; Education: 5.9% Others: 2.0%.
- In terms of class offering time, 49.9% of all class sections in Fall 2017 were offered during the day; 29.9% in the evening; 15.1% were offered on Friday evenings and weekends. The remaining 4.5% included on-line courses, independent studies and field courses.
- In terms of course level, 3.8% of all class sections in Fall 2017 were developmental courses; 47.4% were 000/100 level courses; 32.9% were 200 level courses; 19.1% were 300 and 400 level courses. There was a small number (0.6%) of 500 level courses, which were field classes.

- The departments that offered the largest numbers of sections in Fall 2017 were Biology (160), English (125) and Social & Behavioral Sciences (106).
- The average class-size for all sections was 26.1 in Fall 2017 and 25 in Spring 2018.
- In Fall 2017, sections offered in Nursing and Public Administration had the smallest average class-size (12 and 16.1 respectively). The sections offered by Foreign Languages had the largest average class-size of 37.2.

#### **GRADUATES**



- Total degrees/certificates granted were 1,201, reflecting a 4.7% increase from last year's 1,147.
- Of the 1,201 degrees granted, 588 (49%) were associate degrees, 601 (50%) baccalaureate degrees and 12 certificates (1%).
- Of the eighteen (18) baccalaureate programs with graduates, the Social Work, BS program had the highest average GPA of 3.4, followed by Accounting, Mathematics, Nursing, Childhood Education and Early Childhood Special Education, each with an average GPA of 3.3, and Computer Information Systems and Childhood Special Education, each with an average GPA of 3.1. The number of baccalaureate programs with average graduating GPAs of 3.1 or better is twelve (12), one more that AY 2016-2017.

#### **FACULTY & STAFF**

- Total number of tax-levy employees: 1,086; 602 full-time, 484 part-time, 50.5% female. Grant funded employees: 47 full-time, 409 part-time.
- Total number of tax-levy full-time employees: 185 faculty, 17 executive, 195 managerial and administrative staff, 17 other professional titles, 45 paraprofessional or technical staff, 32 clerical and secretarial staff, 24 skilled craft, and 87 service/maintenance staff.
- The College's overall percentage of teaching load covered by full-time faculty was 42.3% in Fall 2017. The School of Business had the largest percentage of teaching load by full-time faculty at 55%.
- The School of Science, Health and Technology saw a 5% decline in teaching load by full-time faculty from 40.4% in Fall 2016 to 35.4% in Fall 2017. For spring 2018, the decline was 2.8%, from 33.1% in Spring 2017 to 30.3% in Spring 2018.
- The School of Liberal Arts had a teaching load by full-time faculty of 34.5% in Fall 2017 and 31.5% in Spring 2018.
- The newly formed School of Education had a 28.9% full-time teaching load in Fall 2017 and 26.9% in Spring 2018.

#### **GRANTS AND CONTRACTS**

• The total number of grants received in AY 2017-18 was 77. Grant total dollars' amount increased by 12.7% from \$10,359,623 to \$11, 681, 761 in academic year 2017-18. Total grant employees decrease by 1.5% from 463 to 456.

#### SCHOOL OF PROFESSIONAL AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

- The Academy for Youth offered sixteen (16) active programs serving a total of 12,436 participants, ranging from 3 students in the 13-15 age group enrolled in the Tilden Cornerstone program to over 1,769 children and adults in the Crown Heights Beacon Program.
- The Adult and Continuing Education program served 1,564 adults during the year.
- Academy for Career Pathways programs enrolled 427 participants for the academic year, including 410 adults in the CUNY EDGE program.

- The Research and Advocacy Centers, which include the Center for Law and Social Justice, Caribbean Research Center, MEC Immigration Center, and the Center for Black Literature served, 18,563 individuals.
- The School of Professional and Community Development reduced the number of offerings from 18 programs in 2016-17 to 16 programs in 2017-18. The total number of people served was reduced by 18% from 40,355 in AY 2016-17 to 32,990 during this current reporting period.
