- 3. Gen Ed. Committee: M. Crump volunteered to serve on the Gen. Ed. Committee. Motion by Ford, second by Fischer, motion carried unanimously.
- 4. English Department Presentation: Writing For New Media
  - a. Presenter: Dr. Migliaccio of the Department of English presented a new course, entitled Writing for New Media. This is a writing course, focused on rhetorical and critical literacies, for the English BA's professional writing concentration that prepares students to write academically and professionally in a variety of new and emerging digital contexts. Dr. Fischer added that Writing for New Media is offered by English Departments at a range of CUNY campuses.
  - b. Opposition: Dr. Byrum-The course proposed by the Dept. Of English impinges upon the academic domain of the department of Mass Communications-because of the BFA degree, Mass communications is the only department which can offer digital technology and media communications.
  - 5. Discussion by the Committee:
    - a. English and Mass Communications should have a discussion regarding the course with the assistance of the provost before returning to CWCC.
    - b. A crosswalk between the proposed English course and existing course in Mass Communications should be undertaken before returning to the CWCC.
    - c. Discussion on whether it is possible to cross list the course in English and Mass Communications.

- d. The committee agrees to postpone further discussion and vote until the foregoing is completed.
