State Certification Pass Rates

The EPP's completers for 2023 represented all three degrees offered in the School of Education. That is, the Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE), Childhood Special Education (CSE), and Childhood Education (CE). Notably, from 2020 to 2022, program completers were granted "Emergency COVID licenses" by the state, which ceased issuance as of September 1, 2022. The 2023 completers represent the first post-pandemic cohort required to take certification exams for licensure.

The following Data Tables show the pattern of test-taking and pass rates.
