ABOUT GOING FOR GOLD BEHIND THE CAMPAIGN

Going for Gold extends the CEO Cancer Gold Standard® employer accreditation to recognize universities that champion health and well-being by advancing prevention, diagnosis, and quality treatment for cancer for their students, faculty, staff, alumni, parents, and communities. The initiative also enables universities to contribute to research efforts through CEO Roundtable's Project Data Sphere®, which helps expand access to clinical trial research and offers an open-access digital platform for aggregating and analyzing data to advance health equity efforts.

The initiative is focused on the 27 four-year HSIs with at least 60% Hispanic enrollment and seeks to include all 101 HBCUs in the U.S. Of those HBCUs, 50 institutions have health-affiliated programs such as medical schools, nursing, pre-med, health information, and health communication, which provide opportunities for further engagement by partnering on clinical trials, developing health materials, and shaping community outreach.

ABOUT THE PRESIDENT A CLOSER LOOK AT HER BIO

Patricia Ramsey, PhD.

President Medgar Evers College

Dr. Patricia Ramsey, distinguished as a "National Role Model" by Minority Access, Inc., was appointed the sixth president of Medgar Evers College by the City University of New York (CUNY) Board of Trustees. Dr. Ramsey, who officially took office on May 1, 2021, is the first woman and the first scientist to serve as President of the College.



After only six weeks at the helm, Dr. Ramsey submitted a proposal that resulted in a \$20 million grant award, the single largest in the history of Medgar Evers College. Two programs, the Cultivating Holistic Academic Mindsets to Promote Student Success (CHAMPSS) and the Brooklyn Recovery Corps (BRC) programs were created. CHAMPSS provides up to a "full ride" for freshmen who agree to earn their bachelor's degree in four (4) years and transfer students who agree to earn their bachelor's degree in two (2) years. The BRC program provides experiential learning opportunities through paid internships and access to career support, while benefiting communities throughout Brooklyn.

After just three (3) months in the role of President, Dr. Ramsey participated in a press conference where Governor Kathy Hochul (then Lt. Governor) announced a \$9.3 million grant award to support the collaboration of Medgar Evers College, Brooklyn College, and Kingsborough Community College to form a healthcare hub in Central and South Brooklyn. As part of New York State's Workforce Development Initiative, the hub is designed to prepare high school and college students for quality jobs in the healthcare field, while meeting the workforce needs of local businesses.

In less than one year in the position of President, Dr. Ramsey was invited to testify before the Congressional Committee on Education and Labor (now the Committee on Education and the Workforce).

Ms. Susan Haynes

Ms. Susan M. Haynes currently serves as the Interim Executive Director & Labor Designee at Medgar Evers College. Ms. Haynes has over thirty years of progressive HR leadership experience. Ms. Haynes previously managed the faculty and staff wellness and benefit programs at Albany State University. In addition, she formerly worked in a human resources management role for Time Warner Cable of NYC, where she supported a multi-site location for approximately 750 employees.



She also assisted a start-up company in Manhattan, DSL Telecom company, in developing their human resources department for 125 employees; she served as the human resources manager at the Albany Georgia Police Department, where she developed a succession plan for the police officers and civilian staff; has held HR management roles at the Home Depot in both New York City markets and Southwest Georgia, and also worked for Mars Chocolate North America as the people & organization manager where she assisted in developing a diversity and inclusion circle for women aspiring to move into leadership and technical roles. In her role as Executive Director at Communities in Schools of Georgia, Ms. Haynes developed a mentoring program servicing five middle schools in the Southwest Georgia area.

Ms. Haynes, born and raised in Brooklyn, New York, holds a bachelor's degree in business from Bernard M. Baruch College (CUNY), a master's degree in organizational leadership from LaGrange College, and a post-bachelor diploma in human resources management from New York University. Ms. Haynes holds the distinction of being a certified human resource professional and a "Leadership Albany" alumna. Ms. Haynes has served as a board member with several corporate and non-profit companies. Ms. Haynes is currently a doctoral candidate in the J. Mack Robinson School of Business at Georgia State University.

Dr. Leslie Hayes

Leslie A. Hayes, M.D. is the Deputy Commissioner of the Division of Family and Child Health in the New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene. Most recently, Dr. Hayes served as the Chief of Adolescent Medicine at New York Presbyterian Brooklyn Methodist Hospital, Assistant Professor of Clinical Pediatrics at Weill Cornell Medical College, and Faculty Scholar in Health Equity at the Cornell Center of Health Equity and Diversity Center of Excellence, Cornell University.



Dr. Hayes is a thought leader in the healthcare sector with a strong belief in the power of the family unit to affect change through health literacy and empowerment. Her career has focused on public health as her clinical practice has been within complex New York City health systems that provide care to underserved populations in community-based clinics as well as hospital-based academic settings. Her passion for bringing positive change has led to important collaborations with various stakeholders to improve healthcare outcomes for the community.

Dr. Hayes received her B.A. from the University of Pennsylvania, and M.D. from the Mount Sinai School of Medicine (now Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai) in New York City. She completed her pediatric residency at The Children's National Medical Center, Washington, DC, and her adolescent medicine fellowship at The University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey. She holds board certification with American Board of Pediatrics, Subspecialty in Adolescent Medicine.

Dr. Hayes has dedicated her medical career to delivering quality healthcare primarily in underserved New York City communities. She has held leadership roles in several Pediatric Departments and professional organizations. She has served as Director of Adolescent Medicine, Medical Director of School-Based Health, Adolescent Medical Advisor of Metabolic and Bariatric Surgery at various healthcare institutions in New York City.

Mr. Peter Holoman

In the late 1980s, Peter Holoman could be found on the streets of New York, sleeping near Port Authority. One of many New Yorkers, he was caught up in the crack epidemic. A family friend seeing Peter's potential approached him about attending an "HBCU." I thought it was a drug treatment program, Peter said. But those initials stand for historically black colleges and universities. Peter took up the offer and graduated from Atlanta's Clark Atlanta University in 1993 with a



Bachelor of Arts degree in Mass Media Arts-Radio, TV and film.

Over the past 31 years, Peter has been back home providing hope and opportunities to others, particularly at-risk and underrepresented Black males. Currently, Peter serves as the Director of College Advancement & Strategic Partnerships and is the Lead on the Brooklyn Recovery corps Internship Program.

Peter is the co-founder and first Director of the Male Development and Empowerment Center (MDEC), which is the model for the CUNY-wide Black Male Initiative (BMI) several of its programs such as Phat Pockets, a series of financial literacy workshops, Fathers Involvement Initiative, which assisted men in understanding their parental rights and provided resources to support their efforts in being responsible parents was featured in the New York Times, New York Daily News, Amsterdam News, UPN 9 News 9, Tony Brown's Journal and ABC News.

Peter has been a featured and a guest on the Open Line and Week-In-Review, Sunday morning and Sunday evening radio broadcasts on WBLS, 107.5 FM (formally KISS FM, 98.7) in New York City.

Peter received his Master's in Social Work with a concentration in group work in 2010 from the Hunter College School of Social Work in New York City.

Dr. Sewit Teckie

System Chief of Oncology, New York City Health & Hospitals

Sewit Teckie, MD, MBA is a radiation oncologist, health system leader, and researcher. She is System Chief of Oncology at New York City Health and Hospitals where she is responsible for planning and implementation of cancer programs spanning the largest municipal public health system in the United States. She is the Director of Headand-Neck Radiation Oncology at Kings



County Hospital in Brooklyn, where her clinical practice is focused on head-and-neck cancers and brain tumors. She is a Clinical Associate Professor of Radiation Oncology at NYU Grossman School of Medicine. Dr. Teckie is on the Editorial Board of the International Journal of Radiation Oncology Biology and Physics, Applied Radiation Oncology, and ASTRONews. She is a frequent reviewer of journal manuscripts, and she is an invited speaker at local, regional, and national conferences. She takes pride in mentoring medical students and residents.

Dr. Teckie is originally from Eritrea in East Africa. She was born in Eswatini and grew up in Ottawa, Canada and Yonkers, NY. She then attended Harvard College and Harvard Medical School, followed by residency and Chief Residency at Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center. She holds an executive MBA from Columbia University where she received the Dean's Award with Distinction and was selected as class graduation speaker. She lives in New York City with her husband and three children.

Dr. Alcendor completed his post-graduate studies at the NIH and Johns Hopkins University, in Baltimore Maryland in departments of Molecular Virology and Viral Oncology respectively. As a graduate student at the University of California at Davis, he received the Patricia Roberts Harris Graduate Fellowship, was a University of California Davis Mentorship Fellow, a National Heart Lung and Blood Institute Pre-doctoral Fellow, a National Heart Lung and Blood



Institute Post-doctoral Fellow, a Floyd and Mary Schwall, Dissertation Fellow, a National Heart Lung and Blood Institute Spring Fellow, and a recipient of the Merck Special Service Award.

Dr. Alcendor was also a research consultant to the Viral Vector Core Laboratory in Viral Oncology, at Johns Hopkins, and was a Cytomegalovirus Expert for the FDA, Division of Vaccine Injury and Compensation Program for the Department of Health and Human Services in Rockville, Maryland. He has also served as a summer mentor for the Leadership Alliance for the American Society of Microbiology.

He was a mentor for the FDA Office of Minority Health, Health Disparities Fellowship. He was also selected as a Minority Scholar in Cancer Research by the American Association for Cancer Research (AACR). He received the Nashville Business Journal Health Care Hero Award in Research. He was selected as a member of the American Society for Microbiology (ASM) list of distinguished minority microbiologists. He was also a committee member on the independent Research Evaluation and Decision Panel (REDP) for the AIDS Cancer and Specimen Resource of the NCI-AIDS Malignancy Program. He was a Brain-on-chip investigator in partnership with Vanderbilt and the Cleveland Clinic.

Director of the Vanderbilt Short Term Training Program for minority students. He is a member of the Vanderbilt Pre3 Initiative (Preventing Adverse Pregnancy Outcomes & Prematurity).

He is a voting member of the Vanderbilt Institute for Clinical and Translational Research (CTSA) Scientific Review Committee. He is Technical Advisory Group member for the Tennessee Health Care Innovation Initiative Episodes of Care, "HIV Outpatient Skin and Soft Tissue Infection (SSTI) for the State of Tennessee. 

ABOUT EXPLORATION CANCER NURSING DEPARTMENT'S IMMERSIVE EXPERIENCE

Medgar Evers College's award-winning Nursing Department will bring you inside of three distinct Cancer Awareness stations, including:

Symptom Recognition

Learners interact with lifelike simulation models that demonstrate various cancer symptoms. This interactive experience aids in recognizing typical signs of cancer and knowing when to consult a medical professional.

Supportive Care

Simulation scenarios focused on the psychosocial aspects of cancer care, such as delivering bad news, providing emotional support to patients and their families, and discussing palliative care options, can enhance participants' empathy and communication skills.

Cancer Prevention Activities

During the interactive session in the simulation center's studio apartment, participants collaborate to explore lifestyle modifications and risk factor reduction strategies for preventing various types of cancer. This includes discussions on dietary adjustments, physical activity, stress management, and other proactive measures to contribute to overall well-being and reduce the risk of developing cancer.
