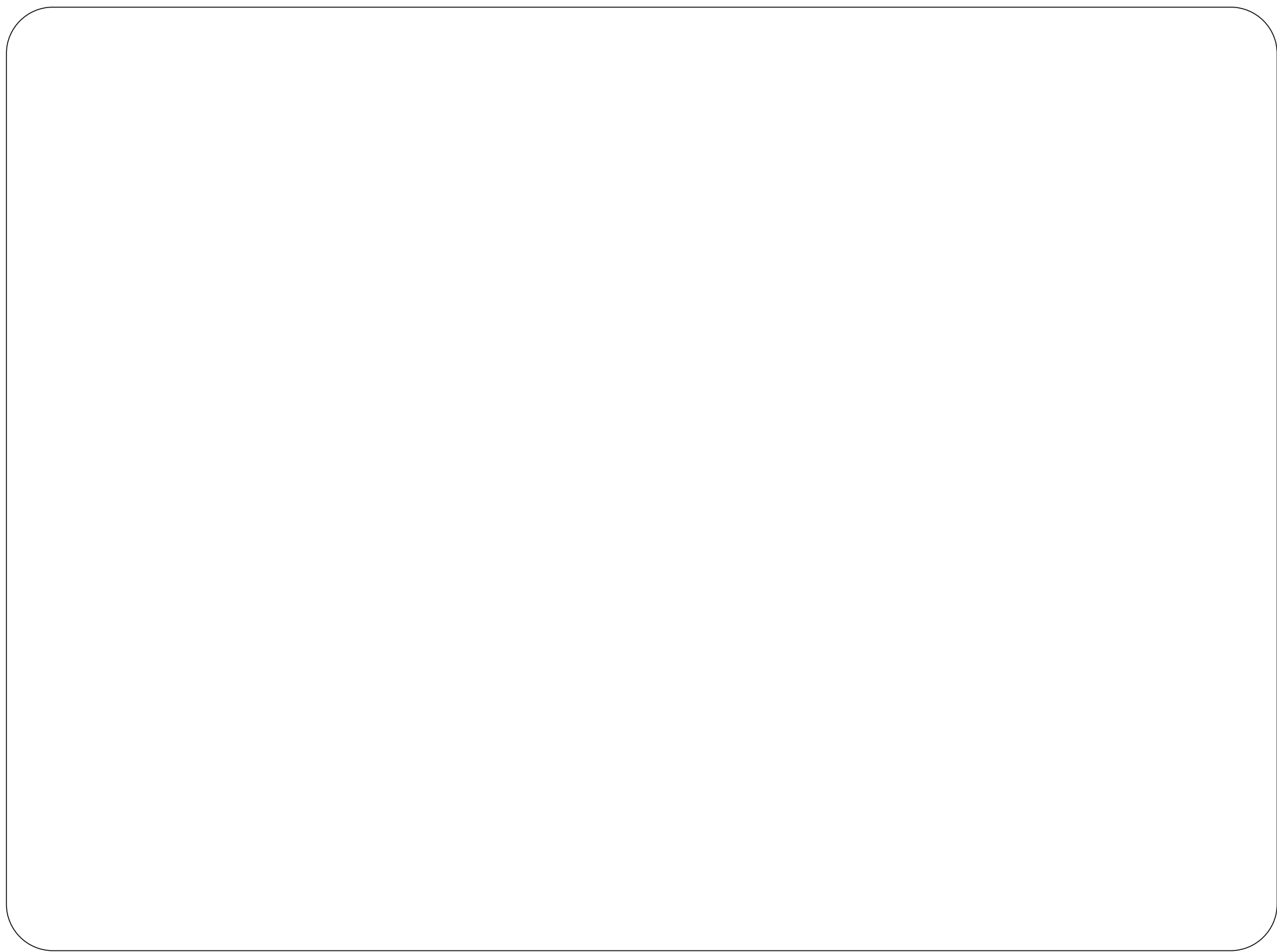

Teacher Certification : NYSTCE Exams

To Obtain initial New York State Certification to teach candidates **MUST PASS** all required sections of the New York certification examination (i.e., you can graduate from MEC with your B.A. but still not be able to teach full-time for the DOE if you haven't passed all of the exams)

ATS-W

- Assessment of Teaching Skills- Written

CST

- Content Specialty Test

Plagiarism Is Academic Dishonesty

- Academic dishonesty of any type, including cheating and plagiarism, is **unacceptable at Medgar Evers College.**
- Academic dishonesty is **punishable** by failure of the test, examination, term paper, or other assignment on which cheating occurred.

Plagiarism: Penalties/ Consequences

Disciplinary proceedings in case of academic dishonesty may result in penalties of admonition, warning, censure, disciplinary probation, restitution, suspension, expulsion, complaint to civil authority, or rejection

What is Plagiarism?

Rita just found some good stuff on the Web for his science unit about sharks. She highlights a paragraph that explains that most sharks grow to be only 3 to 4 feet long and can't hurt people. Rita copies it and pastes it into her report. She quickly changes the font so it matches the rest of the report and continues his research.

What is Plagiarism?

Uh-oh. Rita just made a big mistake. Do you know what she did?

- She committed plagiarism. Plagiarism is when you use someone else's words or ideas and pass them off as your own.
- It's not allowed in school, college, or beyond, so it's a good idea to learn the proper way to use resources, such as websites, books, and magazines.

What is Plagiarism?

Plagiarism is a form of cheating, but it's a little complicated so a person might do it without understanding that it's wrong. Rita should have given the author and the website credit for the information. Why? Because Rita didn't know this information before she came to the website. These aren't her thoughts or ideas.

What You Should Do?
