## SATISFACTION OF EMPLOYERS AND EMPLOYMENT MILESTONES

## (b) EMPLOYMENT MILESTONES: PROFESSIONAL TEACHING EXPERIENCE

EPP graduates reported an 82% employment rate. According to data, 83% from the ECSE group and 80% of the CSE group reported that are employed. 18% of graduates are not currently employed – of this group, three students are looking for employment and four students have chosen not to work (not looking). Those students who reported that they are not employed and not looking have indicated that they made the decision to not work for a variety of Covid-19 related reasons (e.g., vaccine mandate, home schooling-children, and ongoing personal issues). These data disaggregated by program and summarized in Table 3.1. Given the challenges of the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic, most graduates were employed and satisfied with their current employment.

The current employment data demonstrate that out of 38 program completers, 15 (39%) of them were employed after graduation at public schools in New York City. Six program completers are employed at Charter and Private schools (16%).
